

## KV District 4 Brush Creek Hike | Kootenai

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The first 2017 hike for our Selkirk Cabinet Purcell Group (Wednesday, April 26<sup>th</sup>) will be a low level Kootenai River Valley hike between the Selkirk and Purcell mountains. This is part of a series of hikes on and near the Kootenai Valley Railway Roadbed, the Eastside of the Valley. I am calling this one the “Brush Creek Hike (District 4)”.

To avoid the cold and fog, we will be leaving a little later on this one: 9:00AM from the [Big Flag Parking Lot Bonners Ferry](#) and let me know if you want to be picked up at the [Three Mile Junction](#). Bring dog leashes for this hike.

For those of you who like the easy hikes, the most of the trip will be level and only 4.5 miles with several stops. Our own group member Terry Howe will be giving us history lessons along the way.

Terry says: BRUSH CREEK HIKE

This is a 4-5 mile hike starting from the Deer Park Road and proceeding north on the old Kootenai Valley Railway roadbed. We'll travel up Brush Creek on the roadbed of the old Bonners Ferry Lumber Co. logging railroad, come back down and continue along the KVRR. On this day you'll get a rare chance to see an interesting archeological site. A couple of landowners will join us. Bring dog leashes for this hike.
