RESPECT VS. LOVE

The purpose of this document is to define respect, to compare it to love, to what men and women need, and to what to do when receiving love or respect is absent, and giving love or respect is rejected.

Respect Definition:

noun

 a feeling of deep admiration for someone or something elicited by their abilities, qualities, or achievements:

"The director had a lot of respect for Douglas as an actor"

2. due regard for the feelings, wishes, rights, or traditions of others:

"Young people's lack of respect for their parents"

3. a particular aspect, point, or detail:

"The findings in this respect have been mixed"

verb

1. admire (someone or something) deeply, as a result of their abilities, qualities, or achievements:

"She was respected by everyone she worked with"

Women need love and men need respect. Here is a <u>short video</u> that explains the primary needs for men and women, which are different. Video summary: Women need love, Men need respect. Women: love comes naturally. Men: respect comes naturally. These are natural gifts for both. What doesn't come naturally is the opposite gift for both. Men need to understand unconditional love and women need to understand unconditional respect.

Here is a new wrinkle. Respect for men is specific and love for women is general. If I were to list what love my wife (who has passed) needed from me the list would be general terms like: protection, provision, and attention, things all wives need from their husbands to feel loved. However, I will only feel respect for specific things. if she were to list the things she needed to respect in me, they would be the same things other men respect in me, they would be my specific gifts, the things the Lord has given me that are unique to me, and how they shine in the things I produce. The specific things I naturally give of my calling to others. Men naturally give respect for specific things. Women naturally give love with general things.

What if love is rejected? What if respect is rejected? They both never are. Have you ever rejected love. Have you ever rejected respect? How would one reject either?

My situation: I am not respected by my family. Some of my children have taught some of my grandchildren to not respect me, actually they teach to not respect anyone until they prove they deserve respect.

I have a calling that is respected by many people. It is unique. It shines in everything I do. The gift is understanding, which is basically just seeing how things are related, like a dictionary

which shows how words are related, which displays as lists of interconnected lists, the tool to see this display is a relational database, or even an object-oriented database.

This calling shines from everything I am interested in: Business Modeling, Bible Modeling, Business Science, Skiing, Baseball, Softball, Golf, Geography, and History. Because of my work, I am able to see hidden relationships in each of these interests, that other people in these interests do not yet understand. I am not that smart. I did not create these relationships. They are hidden till the definitions display them through the tools.

The reason my calling is respected is the relationships I expose. For example: Mary the mother of God (MOG) shows up in over 400 stories in the last 2,000 years. I can show how those stories changed history each time. Cause and Effect takes time. Her stories effect other stories and world history. There are many other examples: World History in 25 Pages, Acts Continued (3000 Stories) in 60 Pages, Wealthy Saints, UFO Stories, and for Baseball/Softball: How to learn throwing and hitting naturally by just throwing the ball around the infield, including 4 fastballs and 4 curves.

My problem with some of my children and grandchildren is that to respect me they need to know me. If they are boys, I must respect them which is easy for me. If they are girls, I must love them which is hard for me to understand. They are family so we were put together and need love and respect to get along. However, they do not know anything about me. So, I try to educate. If they reject my education, I can't even earn their respect; so, I have to move on.

The purpose of this document is to define respect, to compare it to love, to what men and women need. Respect is specific. Men need specific respect. Love is not specific, but related to respect if absent. Women need love. And to what to do when receiving love or respect is absent. For women, when love is absent from a man, respect the man, it is never rejected. When respect is absent from a woman, educate the woman. When respect is absent from a man, educate the man. When education is rejected, move on. And when giving love or respect is rejected. Nothing to do because it will never happen.
